

WHO RECORDED THE CREATION STORY?

The story of Adam and Eve is contained within the first four chapters of the Book of Genesis. Seth is the logical person to record the age of his father when he died and this can be found in chapter five. Most American seminaries teach there are two authors for the first four chapters and they were written later during the developmental years of the Hebrews in Egypt. This seminary instruction completely destroys the authenticity of the four chapters and naïve students are led to more readily accept Charles Darwin's theory of evolution. I know this firsthand because I was exposed to this diabolical teaching when I attended Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary from 1969 to 1973.

My personal belief is that the first four chapters of Genesis were recorded by Adam and passed on to each generation, eventually making its way to Noah. This included the historical records of the patriarchs during the pre-flood period.

TAUGHT BY JESUS

Adam came into existence as a fully grown man; however, he was like a newborn who did not know who he was, where he came from, or where he was. He was innocent and naive, essentially a blank slate. A baby is educated as it grows up to an

adult; Adam was fully grown and his education began immediately after he came to life.

The first thing Adam needed to learn was a language. A baby has language software built into the soul brain. When an infant listens to the people around him, he hears words, and over time, is able to separate them, slowly learning the use of each word. Using innate intelligence, the child is able to learn the language of his parents. In a multi-lingual household where the parents speak a second language, babies can easily pick up two languages at the same time.

Based upon the meticulous work of Jesus which I have already documented, I am confident that the Son of God uploaded a specific language into the soul brain of Adam. This pre-flood language existed on the earth for more than 1,700 years until the infamous Tower of Babel incident.

"And the whole earth was of one language, and of one speech. And it came to pass, as they journeyed from the east, that they found a plain in the land of Shinar; and they dwelt there.

And they said one to another, Go to, let us make brick, and burn them throughly. And they had brick for stone, and slime had they for morter.

And they said, Go to, let us build us a city and a tower, whose top may reach unto heaven; and let us make us a name, lest we be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth.

And the LORD came down to see the city and the tower, which the children of men builded. And the LORD said, Behold, the people is one, and they have all one language; and this they begin to do: and now nothing will be restrained from them, which they have imagined to do.

Go to, let us go down, and there confound their language, that they may not understand one another's speech. So the LORD scattered them abroad from thence upon the face of all the earth: and they left off to build the city.

Therefore is the name of it called Babel; because the LORD did there confound the language of all the earth: and from thence did the LORD scatter them abroad upon the face of all the earth."

(Genesis 11:1-9)

Jesus communicated with Adam and instructed him in what he needed to know. Adam's sole job was to maintain the Garden of Eden, ensuring it continued to look like a park and that the trees and the plants were fertilized. This means that Jesus instructed Adam in agriculture and furnished him with tools to perform the job.

"And the LORD God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it." (Genesis 2:15)

Adam soon learned about the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil. Jesus explicitly stated that mankind was not to eat the fruit from this tree.

Any violation of this commandment would result in immediate death. Adam recognized that he had a beginning, and therefore his life and existence in the garden would come to an abrupt end if he disobeyed his Creator.

"And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: **But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it**: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die." (Genesis 2:16-17)

It is important to note that Jesus did not tell Adam why he could not eat of this particular tree. Man was told to listen and obey because this is what was expected. Some 4,000 years later Jesus would reveal that He equated love with obedience. Anyone who claims to love God, must also obey His instructions.

"If ye love me, keep my commandments." (John 14:15)

As the Creator, Jesus knew that it was not good for Adam to be alone; he needed companionship because that is how humanity was designed.

"And the LORD God said, It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him an help meet for him." (Genesis 2:18)

To this end, and to reveal the gap that existed in his life, Jesus furnished Adam with a course in zoology, bringing every animal, bird, and living creature to Adam so he could name them.

"And out of the ground the LORD God formed every beast of the field, and every fowl of the air; and brought them unto Adam to see what he would call them: and whatsoever Adam called

every living creature, that was the name thereof.

And Adam gave names to all cattle, and to the fowl of the air, and to every beast of the field; but for Adam there was not found an help meet for him." (Genesis 2:19-20)

THE CLONING OF EVE

In order to populate the earth with humanity, it was first necessary to create a female counterpart to Adam. Christians reading this narrative before 1950 could not fully understand the text because mankind's level of technology had not risen sufficiently to comprehend that Jesus performed major surgery on Adam. I imagine that the Son of God set up a temporary hospital, Adam was put under anesthesia, and then the Son of God opened his chest and removed a rib.

"And the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and he slept: and he took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof;" (Genesis 2:21)

Jesus took cells from the rib, modified the DNA, and the body of Eve was formed in the same way Adam's body was constructed. However, unlike the male body, she was equipped with reproductive organs which made it possible to become pregnant and carry a baby in her womb. Eve's body was that of an adult, and the moment the physical body was finished, a soul/spirit was paired with it and that's when she came to life.

"And the rib, which the LORD God had taken from man, made he a woman, and brought her unto the man." (Genesis 2:22)

There is no timeline, but it is obvious that Adam was not standing idly by watching the events of Eve's creation since the text states that Jesus

brought her to him. I suspect that Adam's reaction was the same as every groom that sees his bride – one of wonder and awe! Eve was given the same ability to hear and speak. While it is not explicitly stated, Jesus must have explained to Adam that Eve was taken from him.

"And Adam said, This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man." (Genesis 2:23)

It is obvious that Jesus took the time to present the perpetual law of marriage to Adam and Eve. This is why Adam stated the following:

"Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh." (Genesis 2:24)

Adam and Eve inherently knew that they were male/female counterparts. There was an instant attraction as man met woman for the first time. This, of course, was perfectly natural and precisely what Jesus intended. It was also logical that they should begin to explore their sexuality since they were both naked. (The concept of shame being associated with nakedness would not come until later with the advent of sin.)

Adam was handsome and Eve was gorgeous. The sexual attraction was immediate. We don't know how long it took, but holding hands led to hugging. Standing close to each other led to kissing and the feeling was absolutely electrifying when their lips met. Feeling the warmth as their bare chests met was intoxicating and left them wanting more. Each step of intimacy discovered by Adam and Eve was planned by Jesus as they learned to enjoy the physical pleasure associated with marriage. People might think that God is a prude when it comes to things sexual, but they fail to take into account that Jesus created us to be sexually active

within the bounds of marriage. It is one of His gifts to humanity.

And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not ashamed." (Genesis 2:25)

For most humans, sexual intercourse is limited to procreation and pleasure, but there is also a spiritual aspect as well. There is a lifelong bond that occurs from this physical union and this is why your spouse is also your soulmate. It is a link that is supposed to last until your time on earth comes to an end.

REPLENISHING THE EARTH

Jesus provided Adam and Eve with basic knowledge about the world around them. They were told that "God" (Elohim) existed. The word "Elohim" occurs 2,601 times in the Bible. Every instance of "God" in the first chapter of Genesis refers to God in plurality. I don't know why the Bible translators rendered this word as singular; however, they were true to the text in verse 26 when God refers to Himself in plurality.

"And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth." (Genesis 1:26)

Adam and Eve were informed about the earth's refurbishment, but they did not fully understand what transpired since they were ignorant about the rest of the universe. The first man knew how to speak, but it is clear that Jesus also taught him to read and write and Adam faithfully recorded what he was told.

"So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them. And God blessed them, and God

said unto them, **Be fruitful, and multiply, and**replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have
dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the
fowl of the air, and over every living thing that
moveth upon the earth." (Genesis 1:27-28)

Adam and Eve were told to replenish the earth with children. The word "replenish" means to restock, replace something that was lost. The same word is found in the ninth chapter of Genesis when Noah and his sons were instructed to "replenish" the earth after the flood. This means that our understanding of a pre-Adamic world is true; Adam and Eve were to replenish the earth just like Noah and his sons would do after the flood.

"And God blessed Noah and his sons, and said unto them, **Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth**." (Genesis 9:1)

There are some that would argue that the King James translators were in error and the word "replenish" actually means "fill." God was in fact instructing Adam and Noah in both instances to "fill" the earth. The problem is that these same people reject the idea of a pre-Adamic world (i.e. gap theory, ruin-reconstruction theory), claiming that sin did not exist prior to the fall of mankind in the Garden of Eden. They overlook the fact that Lucifer is the original sinner; he is responsible for introducing death and destruction as a result of his decision to rebel against God.

VEGETARIANS

Jesus designed all creatures on earth to be vegetarians. The killing of different species was not allowed prior to the fall of mankind because sin had not yet been introduced. The earth will revert to the same condition during the Thousand Years Kingdom in the end times when the wolf and the lamb will live together in harmony.

"The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; and the calf and the young lion and the fatling together; and a little child shall lead them.

And the cow and the bear shall feed; their young ones shall lie down together: and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.

And the sucking child shall play on the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put his hand on the cockatrice' den.

They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my holy mountain: for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the LORD, as the waters cover the sea." (Isaiah 11:6-9)

The refurbishing was intended to make the planet into a beautiful paradise without sin. It was perfect and filled with goodness. Sin and death were not yet introduced to make the earth into what we know today.

"And God said, Behold, I have given you every herb bearing seed, which is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree, in the which is the fruit of a tree yielding seed; to you it shall be for meat.

And to every beast of the earth, and to every fowl of the air, and to every thing that creepeth upon the earth, wherein there is life, I have given every green herb for meat: and it was so." (Genesis 1:29-30)

THE SEVENTH DAY

The refurbishment of the earth ended with Jesus resting on the seventh day from all His works. This

indicates there was no further activity from the Son of God during the next 1,000 earth years as He rested for a day. Lucifer was not allowed to begin the temptation until the day of rest was finished.

"And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was very good. And the evening and the morning were the sixth day." (Genesis 1:31)

"Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them. And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made. And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it he had rested from all his work which God created and made." (Genesis 2:1-3)

I was brought up with the belief that Adam and Eve spent an unknown amount of time in the Garden of Eden. How much time exactly? Some would estimate that it was a couple of weeks, maybe a month, or perhaps half a year before they were tempted by Lucifer and disobeyed Jesus. That is the belief of most Christians. I would submit that Adam and Eve spent a lot of time in the Garden of Eden – more than a thousand years! They were created on the sixth day. Remember that one day in heaven is the equivalent of a thousand years on earth.

"But, beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that **one day is with the Lord as a thousand years**, and a thousand years as one day." (2
Peter 3:8)

 $^{^{1}}$ Jesus was not tired; rather, it was an example for humanity. We are to work for six days and rest on the seventh day. Exodus 20:8-11

We don't know exactly when they were created on the sixth day. It could have occurred at the 100-year mark, the 500-year mark, or sometime toward the end of the sixth day. We simply don't know. What we do know is that Jesus created the land creatures and then mankind was introduced. Jesus and Adam devoted time to naming the animals and then Eve was created. The text then concludes the sixth day.

What we can accurately deduce is that Adam and Eve lived for more than a thousand years in the incredible Garden of Eden. They were obviously sexually active after they were introduced. Did they produce any children during the seventh day? This is an important question and I don't know if most people have given it any thought. For a long time, I believed that Cain and Abel were the first offspring of Adam and Eve, but it would be misleading to assume they were sexually abstinent, couldn't figure out the birds and the bees, or somehow couldn't conceive until after they were expelled from the Garden of Eden.

HUMANITY'S PERSPECIVE

Examining the fourth chapter of Genesis from humanity's viewpoint, we are informed how Lucifer used the serpent's body to speak with Eve when she was alone. Adam was created first and had spent the most time with Jesus. It was up to Adam to pass along what he learned to his wife. This made Eve the weaker vessel and explains why she was targeted by Lucifer.

"Now the serpent was more subtil than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said unto the woman, Yea, hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden?"

(Genesis 3:1)

Eve did not register surprise that the snake could speak. Her reaction was indicative of the fact that animals could speak before the fall of mankind. Have you played the game of telephone? It's a game where the first person whispers a phrase or sentence to the second person, who relays it to the next person down the line. The round ends when the last person speaks out loud what they received. It is comical to hear the comparison and that is exactly what took place with Eve when she lopsidedly replied to the serpent that in addition to not eating the forbidden the fruit, they also could not touch it.

"And the woman said unto the serpent, We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden: But of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God hath said, Ye shall not eat of it, neither shall ye touch it, lest ye die." (Genesis 3:2-3)

Lucifer is known as the father of lies.² He certainly was deceitful in his interaction with Eve, but he mixed the falsehood with truth. It was true that Eve would not immediately suffer a physical death, that would come later, but Lucifer knew that spiritual death would be instantaneous. He further intoned that Eve and her husband would be enlightened – just like Jesus!

"And the serpent said unto the woman, Ye shall not surely die: For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil." (Genesis 3:4-5)

Eve considered the lie wrapped with truth. She had always wondered how the forbidden fruit tasted. It certainly looked delicious and the fruit's aroma smelled so good. The words chosen by Lucifer were designed to play upon Eve's emotions and tilt her in the fallen cherub's direction. She immediately recognized after biting

into the fruit that her life was forever changed and without delay sought Adam to compel him to join her.

"And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat." (Genesis 3:6)

As they were infused with the sin nature, the first two humans knew they were ruined and in a hopeless situation. They disobeyed Jesus' explicit instructions. There was an overwhelming sense of shame about their nakedness.

"And the eyes of them both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together, and made themselves aprons." (Genesis 3:7)

Jesus visited the garden every day to spend time with Adam and Eve. When He arrived at the regular time, they were ashamed and scared to the point that they hid themselves.

"And they heard the voice of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day: and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God amongst the trees of the garden." (Genesis 3:8)

In the ensuing interaction, Jesus innocently called out about their location. Adam had spent a lot of time with Jesus and suddenly he was afraid of his Creator. The first man had been naked for some 1,500 years and suddenly he was ashamed of his condition. Jesus innocently questioned Adam about his naked state and rhetorically asked if he had rebelled and eaten the forbidden fruit.

"And the LORD God called unto Adam, and said unto him, Where art thou?

And he said, I heard thy voice in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself.

And he said, Who told thee that thou wast naked? Hast thou eaten of the tree, whereof I commanded thee that thou shouldest not eat?" (Genesis 3:9-11)

Then the blame game started. Adam looked at his beautiful wife and disgustedly pointed the finger at her.

Eve in turn accused the serpent of mesmerizing her with his words.

"And the man said, The woman whom thou gavest to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I did eat.

And the LORD God said unto the woman, What is this that thou hast done? And the woman said, The serpent beguiled me, and I did eat." (Genesis 3:12-13)

THE PENALTY OF SIN

Jesus began meting out judgment with the serpent. Lucifer was no longer in its physical body since he had dumped the snake as soon as Eve ate the forbidden fruit. Most likely the snake had legs just like a lizard. The serpent that Lucifer possessed had allowed Lucifer to enter his body and possess him. The Son of God would not have punished the serpent if he was blameless. Clearly he had a free will and could have refused Lucifer's request. The first creature seduced was the serpent. Jesus' judgment on the serpent applied to all snakes throughout the world as the Creator took away their legs and forced them to crawl

upon their bellies. They were so low to the ground that it was almost like dust was to be food.

"And the LORD God said unto the serpent,
Because thou hast done this, thou art cursed
above all cattle, and above every beast of the
field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt
thou eat all the days of thy life: And I will put
enmity between thee and the woman, and
between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise
thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel."
(Genesis 3:14-15)

Eve was next in the sequence to be judged. Up to this time, Eve conceived children with no difficulty, and when her babies were born, there was no pain and the birthing process was easy. The Creator stated it would be different going forward. There would now be intense pain and this judgment applied to every woman going forward. Eve was also to be subject to her husband, Adam, and this verdict also applied to all women going forward.

"Unto the woman he said, I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception; in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire shall be to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee." (Genesis 4:16)

The last one to be judged was Adam. Jesus cursed the entire planet because of man's mistake. Instead of reaping bountiful harvests effortlessly, men would have to work hard to prepare for a harvest. Jesus introduced the concept of weeds, thorns, and thistles that would invade every patch of land being farmed. This curse upon men would make living on earth a laborious task.

"And unto Adam he said, Because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast

eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed is the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life; Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field; In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return."

(Genesis 4:17-19)

Adam and Eve were naked from the day of their creation – a time period of at least 1,500 years. Logically this would have applied to their children prior to the first couple sinning. An ice canopy enveloped the earth high in the atmosphere so no ultra-violet rays from the sun penetrating it and the temperature was pleasant. It was a perfect climate that was temperate and this is why clothing was not needed. When sin infected the human race, Jesus knew nakedness would lead to sexual lust and perversion and this is why He clothed them.

"And Adam called his wife's name Eve; because she was the mother of all living. Unto Adam also and to his wife did the LORD God make coats of skins, and clothed them." (Genesis 4:20-21)

It is important to understand that the billions of offspring of Adam and Eve were likewise contaminated with the sin nature. The animal kingdom was similarly affected as some animals became predatory and began to kill and eat the flesh of their victims.

"For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the manifestation of the sons of God. For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of him who hath

subjected the same in hope, Because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now." (Romans 8:19-22)

Jesus recognized that Adam and Eve now had the ability to differentiate between good and evil. It was possible for them to remain in the Garden of Eden in their fallen state for eternity by eating from the Tree of Life. As a result, steps were taken to mitigate the introduction of sin and limit mankind's ability to access this "fountain of youth."

"And the LORD God said, Behold, the man is become as one of us, to know good and evil: and now, lest he put forth his hand, and take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live for ever:

Therefore the LORD God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken. So he drove out the man; and he placed at the east of the garden of Eden

Cherubims, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to keep the way of the tree of life."

(Genesis 3:22-24)

Eve eventually gave birth to two sons after mankind's eviction from the Garden of Eden.

"And Adam knew Eve his wife; and she conceived, and bare Cain, and said, I have gotten a man from the LORD. And she again bare his brother Abel. And Abel was a keeper of sheep, but Cain was a tiller of the ground." (Genesis 4:1-2)

Cain and Abel listened to their parents' recount stories about the wonderful Garden of Eden and learned about the ramifications that came with their expulsion. This is why these two young men were offering sacrifices to the Lord. The problem was that Cain wanted to do it his own way. He wanted to offer God the very best of his crop. The predicament was that Jesus looked upon it as a subpar sacrifice, and while the effort was made in good faith, it was nevertheless rejected. Maybe the situation would have been different if Cain had known the background story for the blood sacrifice.³ But he wasn't provided that knowledge, and as a result, he harbored resentment against Jesus, and especially his brother.

"And in process of time it came to pass, that
Cain brought of the fruit of the ground an
offering unto the LORD. And Abel, he also
brought of the firstlings of his flock and of the
fat thereof. And the LORD had respect unto Abel
and to his offering. But unto Cain and to his
offering he had not respect. And Cain was very
wroth, and his countenance fell." (Genesis 4:3-5)

Jesus set up the earth to be an agrarian society. Both men were involved in agriculture; Cain grew fruits and vegetables while Abel was a sheepherder. When the time came for sacrifice, Abel was able to select a sheep from his flock, but this was not the case with Cain. For some reason he did not want to trade or ask his brother for a sheep, and when his sacrifice was rejected, it made him very angry. Jesus warned Cain that he was at a critical junction that would alter the course of his life.

"And the LORD said unto Cain, Why art thou wroth? and why is thy countenance fallen? If

thou doest well, shalt thou not be accepted? and if thou doest not well, sin lieth at the door. And unto thee shall be his desire, and thou shalt rule over him." (Genesis 4:6-7)

The point of contention was so sharp that Cain eventually struck Abel in a fit of rage and killed him.

"And Cain talked with Abel his brother: and it came to pass, when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother, and slew him." (Genesis 4:8)

Jesus came from heaven and confronted Cain and banished him from the area where he lived with his mother and father.

"And the LORD said unto Cain, Where is Abel thy brother? And he said, I know not: Am I my brother's keeper? And he said, What hast thou done? the voice of thy brother's blood crieth unto me from the ground. And now art thou cursed from the earth, which hath opened her mouth to receive thy brother's blood from thy hand; When thou tillest the ground, it shall not henceforth yield unto thee her strength; a fugitive and a vagabond shalt thou be in the earth." (Genesis 4:9-12)

The murder of a family member was shocking. After all, this was the first death of a human being. Here comes the interesting part. Cain was absolutely terrified that someone would take revenge and kill him. To whom was he referring? The traditional thought is that Adam and Eve only conceived two children at this point in time. Was Cain fearful of his parents? No parent having lost one child, is going to kill their remaining child. To whom is the text referring?

"And Cain said unto the LORD, My punishment is greater than I can bear. Behold, thou hast driven me out this day from the face of the earth; and from thy face shall I be hid; and I shall be a fugitive and a vagabond in the earth; and it shall come to pass, that every one that findeth me shall slay me." (Genesis 4:13-14)

The open secret is that Adam and Eve were created perfectly; they procreated in the Garden of Eden. Cain was afraid of his older siblings and the vast extended family. This was made possible because death, disease, and fertility issues did not exist prior to the fall of mankind. As a result, Jesus set a special mark upon Cain and threatened severe retribution against those who sought revenge.

"And the LORD said unto him, Therefore whosoever slayeth Cain, vengeance shall be taken on him sevenfold. And the LORD set a mark upon Cain, lest any finding him should kill him." (Genesis 4:15)

Cain subsequently moved to a place east of the Garden of Eden called Nod.

"And Cain went out from the presence of the LORD, and dwelt in the land of Nod, on the east of Eden." (Genesis 4:16)

More than likely Cain met his wife in Nod since there is no mention of her joining him as an outcast. Who did he marry? The immediate conclusion is that he married a sister, but if there were billions of humans alive at this time, it was certainly a relative of some kind.

"And Cain knew his wife; and she conceived, and bare Enoch: and he builded a city, and called the name of the city, after the name of his son, Enoch." (Genesis 4:16-17)

It makes sense that Adam and Eve were sexually active. When did this begin? In the Garden of Eden. It would be absurd to think they waited more than a millennium to come together as a couple! Abstinence would have been the only form of contraception available to them. It is highly unlikely they struggled to conceive because of a low sperm count or an ovulation problem since they were examples of biological perfection. There was absolutely no chance that Eve miscarried or had stillborn babies because sin was not yet in play.

In this perfect environment, is it implausible that Eve gave birth to a baby each year shortly after she was created? Assuming that she came into existence in the middle of the sixth day, this would give her a time period of 1,500 years to conceive at least that many children assuming she and Adam conceived once a year. Once these children came of age, they married siblings and began to have children of their own. It is conceivable that sixty generations were alive on earth. At the end of the seventh day, a conservative estimate would place billions of people on the planet and this is a credible explanation for where Cain found a wife in the land of Nod and whom he feared would take his life in retribution.

The Bible says that Adam and Eve copulated, she became pregnant, and Cain was born. The text does not plainly state that Cain was Eve's first child. This is an important distinction! Cain and Abel were certainly the first children born after Adam and Eve were evicted from the Garden of Eden. When Seth recorded the death of his father, he wrote that his father was 130 years old when his mother gave birth to him. He stated that Adam lived 800 more years before he died.

"And Adam lived an hundred and thirty years, and begat a son in his own likeness, after his image; and called his name Seth: And the days of Adam after he had begotten Seth were eight hundred years: and he begat sons and daughters: And all the days that Adam lived were nine hundred and thirty years: and he died." (Genesis 5:3-5)

My personal belief is that Seth did not count Adam and Eve's time in the Garden of Eden. This would be the remainder of the sixth day when they were created and the seventh day. Seth calculated his father's age from the time he ate the forbidden fruit – 930 years. If Adam's creation was the five-hundred-year mark on the sixth day, with the thousand years of the seventh day, he would have been 2,430 years old when he died! It is not implausible that there were far more humans on earth than today.

In this scenario, death, disease, and fertility problems do not exist because sin is not yet in play. If Adam and Eve procreated once a year over a 1,500-year period. Imagine their children also pairing up as couples, beginning to procreate at the age of 25, and each couple having a child once a year. A conservative estimate would place about 60 generations born during this time period. When this complex equation is worked out, the population would be more than 576 quadrillion. (576,460,752,303,423,486)

THE ANGELIC PERSPECTIVE

With the passing of the seventh day, Jesus made an announcement on intergalactic television that the first action in proving the righteousness of the Godhead was going to take place. Lucifer would be given a chance to prove his accusation. For the first time in 7,000 years, he would have access to the refurbished earth and its inhabitants. Lucifer's

once-beautiful body had been reduced to ashes. Since he existed in the spirit realm, this necessitated obtaining a willing host in the physical world which he could use as a disguise to tempt humanity. If the creature refused to lend out his body, that would be the end of Lucifer's chance to prove that God is unrighteous.

On the anticipated day, the angels and other beings in the universe were captivated by the drama being played out on their television sets. No one in the physical realm saw Lucifer predatorily enter the Garden of Eden. The animal kingdom was unaware they were being carefully studied by a slick con artist who decided his best choice for success was a serpent.

"Now the serpent was more subtil than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made." (Genesis 3:1a)

A group of fallen angels created a hologram that looked like a dazzling angel of light. Lucifer positioned himself in the midst and spoke to the serpent who had been created with great intelligence, that according to the Bible, made him sly, artful, and cunning. The holy angels in the heavens watched with deep disgust as Lucifer promised the serpent a fantastic future if he just allowed the use of his body for a short time. The persuasion was so strong that the serpent readily agreed and he was immediately possessed by Lucifer.

"And no marvel; for **Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light**. Therefore
it is no great thing if his ministers also be
transformed as the ministers of righteousness;
whose end shall be according to their works." (2
Corinthians 11:14-15)

Lucifer had already determined that Eve was the weaker link and he waited patiently until Adam

was occupied in some other place of the garden. That is when he engaged Eve in conversation, who was not surprised that a serpent was speaking to her because she and Adam often talked to different species. She was unconcerned and figured it was just going to be another nice conversation.

Positioning himself in the midst of the garden close to the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil, Lucifer masterfully probed whether every tree in the garden was good for food. For more than a thousand years Eve had never entertained a thought about eating fruit from the forbidden tree. She had enjoyed a great life with Adam and liked spending time with Jesus in the cool of the evening. She felt loved by her Creator and was not prepared for this clever onslaught. As a happy wife and mother, Eve had no clue she was encountering the most skilled seducer and con artist in the universe.

"And he said unto the woman, **Yea, hath God** said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden?" (Genesis 3:1b)

Lucifer's words were designed to make Eve question everything she knew to be true. Instead of telling the serpent to be quiet and to seek out Adam for him to join the conversation, she repeated what Adam had told her, that all the trees were open for them to eat with the exception of the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil. Eating its fruit would lead to death. She went so far as to say that touching the tree would likewise lead to death. Most likely she did not have a concept of death since she had lived for more than a thousand years, during which time she had not aged or ever been sick.

"And the woman said unto the serpent, We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden: But of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God hath said, **Ye shall not eat of it**, neither shall ye touch it, **lest ye die**." (Genesis 3:2-3)

Angels as numerous as the sand of the sea watched as Lucifer doubled down on his lie and added some truth to his deceitful strategy. This half-truth was even more dangerous than a full-blown lie, because while Eve could easily detect a lie, the half-truth was designed to mislead her until it was too late.

"And the serpent said unto the woman, Ye shall not surely die: For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil." (Genesis 3:4-5)

The situation was suddenly reversed as Lucifer told Eve she would be just like the Creator after eating the fruit. This was a bold approach. Who wouldn't want to be like Jesus? Lucifer's words put doubt in Eve's mind and resonated with her. She had not thought of it that way. Clearly, Jesus was holding her back and not letting her be the person she could be.

"And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat." (Genesis 3:6)

Eve's thoughts were projected on television as she gazed upon the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil and saw its appealing fruit. It is important to keep in mind that Eve was a happy wife and mother, having only known good up to this point in her life. She had no concept of evil or sin. She didn't know that her action was about to

drastically change the course of human history.

Angels watched in horror as she picked a ripe fruit from the forbidden tree, admiring it briefly before bringing it to her lips and taking a bite.

Predictably, it was delicious because everything that Jesus made was good, even if it existed solely as a temptation and consuming it was prohibited.

It only took a second as the holy angels saw a dark shadow cover Eve and her spirit died. She became filled with a sinful nature. Satan's ploy had worked perfectly and his work was done. Eve did not physically die, but just as Jesus promised, she was dead nonetheless. Her spirit which had previously communed with Jesus became lifeless because of her sinful action and she was immediately transferred to the Kingdom of Satan. Eve stood there in this enlightened state, her mind exploring evil, aware of the fact that she was different now.

The new state of existence was certainly a different experience and eventually Eve realized the serpent was gone. Lucifer watched jubilantly, believing that he had checkmated the human race in one move! The foolish woman had chosen him over Jesus! All the time and effort Jesus invested into Eve was quickly traded for one bite of a forbidden fruit based upon a half-truth. How disappointing it was for the Creator that Eve had thrown everything away rather than loving Jesus and following His instructions.

Intergalactic television showed an evil spirit placed in Eve. This was allowed because she was now part of the Kingdom of Satan. Eve didn't know it, but she had become an envoy of Lucifer and her first desire to her new lord was the recruitment of Adam. She wanted to make sure that he joined her in the same "enlightened" state.

Adam smiled as he saw his wife approaching, but it was replaced with somber look as Eve bizarrely held the forbidden fruit in her hand and related what she had done. He remembered Jesus' clear warning.

"But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die."

(Genesis 2:17)

Yet here was Eve standing in front of him, alive, and beautiful as ever! How could this be? He closed his eyes and thought about Jesus and all the time they had spent together. Jesus' command not to eat of the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil was clear. Adam wanted to be loyal to his Creator, having known Jesus long before he was acquainted with his wife. Then Adam looked upon Eve's gorgeous body, memories of them making love flooded his mind. He loved the dimples in her cheeks when she smiled and the look in her eyes that she reserved only for him. The physical influences were seemingly irresistible. Could he really discard Eve?

Eve stood there with a fruit in her hand and begged him to eat it. Adam loved Jesus, but he realized that he loved Eve more. He stretched out his hand, took the fruit and bit into it. It was delicious just like Eve said, but more importantly, he was still alive. Adam did not see as a dark shadow also covered him as his spirit died. The holy angels watched the drama play out on the intergalactic television network and a great sadness came upon them in the different galaxies and in heaven itself.

"And **Adam was not deceived**, but the woman being deceived was in the transgression." (1 Timothy 2:14)

Moments after Adam bit into the forbidden fruit and started chewing it, television cameras panned the earth and holy angels saw shadows cover his offspring. The spirits of these beautiful men and women died as a result of the actions of the two original progenitors.

"Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned: (For until the law sin was in the world: but sin is not imputed when there is no law. Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over them that had not sinned after the similitude of Adam's transgression, who is the figure of him that was to come." (Romans 5:12-14)

Lucifer's victory was complete! He had targeted Eve first because she was the weaker of the two; using Eve to coerce Adam – clearly the stronger of the two – into disobeying Jesus. It was an absolute master stroke since Adam would have rejected Lucifer's direct temptation. Lucifer and everyone that joined his rebellion were jubilant! Jesus had labored for some 7,000 years to set up the new race, and in just a few moments, Lucifer had been able to destroy it all.

Adam and Eve were experiencing a growing uneasiness. Something was very wrong! Adam looked upon Eve and suddenly realized that she was naked. To make matters worse, he was in the same predicament. Why hadn't Jesus told them that they were naked? The half-truth spoken by Lucifer was confirmed.

"For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil."

(Genesis 3:5)

Adam and Eve began to comprehend that they were different now. Eating the forbidden fruit had changed something. They were aware of the fact that they were completely uncovered and in desperation they tried to make some kind of covering of leaves to conceal their nakedness.

"And the eyes of them both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together, and made themselves aprons." (Genesis 3:7)

Adam and Eve were unexpectedly gripped by fear when they heard Jesus calling to them in evening. Why were they afraid of God? Jesus had visited them in the same manner every day, what cause did they have to be frightened of their Creator?

"And they heard the voice of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day: and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God amongst the trees of the garden." (Genesis 3:8)

The answer was that sin had irreversibly gained access to humanity. Across the universe, angels wondered what Jesus would do now?

THE TRIAL OF HUMANITY

Jesus walked to the area where He knew that Adam and Eve were hiding. This was similar to a parent playing hide-and-seek with a child who has done a poor job at hiding.

"And the LORD God called unto Adam, and said unto him, Where art thou?" (Genesis 3:9)

Adam responded to the familiar voice of Jesus and emerged from his hiding spot. Trembling with fear, he related that he was afraid because he was naked.

"And he said, I heard thy voice in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself." (Genesis 3:10)

Jesus looked upon Adam and asked the obvious question. Why was Adam suddenly concerned about being naked? This hadn't been an issue for over a thousand years.

"And he said, Who told thee that thou wast naked?" (Genesis 3:11a)

This was followed by a rhetorical question.

"Hast thou eaten of the tree, whereof I commanded thee that thou shouldest not eat?" (Genesis 3:11b)

The blame game started with Adam throwing Eve under the proverbial bus. The romantic feelings that had caused him to join his wife in disobeying Jesus were gone as Adam sought to distance himself from his corrupt wife.

"And the man said, The woman whom thou gavest to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I did eat." (Genesis 3:12)

Eve in turn blamed the serpent for eating from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil.

And the LORD God said unto the woman, What is this that thou hast done? And the woman said, The serpent beguiled me, and I did eat." (Genesis 3:13)

Human nature has not changed during the last 6,000 years as neither Adam nor Eve wanted to be held accountable for their actions.

Jesus ignored the blame game and announced the verdict. He held the serpent responsible for loaning his body to Lucifer. The serpent possessed a free will and used it to rebel against Jesus. All serpents onward would subsequently be cursed and lose their legs.

"And the LORD God said unto the serpent, **Because thou hast done this, thou art cursed**above all cattle, and above every beast of the

field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt
thou eat all the days of thy life." (Genesis 3:14)

Jesus prophesied that a state of war would exist between the seed of the serpent (Lucifer) and the seed of the woman (humanity). In due time, Lucifer would be crushed.

"And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel." (Genesis 3:15)

All women were cursed and sentenced to a difficult birth of their children; they would be tied to their husbands and destined to be ruled by men.

"Unto the woman he said, I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception; in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire shall be to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee." (Genesis 3:16)

All men were sentenced to hard labor and the surface of the earth was cursed. Men would have difficulty making a living.

"And unto Adam he said, Because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed is the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life;

Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field;

In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return." (Genesis 3:17-19)

Adam and Eve – along with their offspring – were driven out from the Garden of Eden. Cherubim were assigned to guard the entrance and deny access to humanity. A rotating flaming sword secured the Tree of Life so that Adam could no longer eat from it. One act of disobedience cost Adam and Eve the close fellowship they had with Jesus and their paradise lifestyle.

"And the LORD God said, Behold, the man is become as one of us, to know good and evil: and now, lest he put forth his hand, and take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live for ever:

Therefore the LORD God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken. So he drove out the man; and he placed at the east of the garden of Eden

Cherubims, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to keep the way of the tree of life."

(Genesis 3:22-24)

All the holy angels along with Lucifer and his minions learned that blame could not be assigned to the Godhead. Adam and Eve had been warned; they enjoyed a fantastic life where every need was met, but they chose to rebel and lost it all.

Lucifer was beside himself with joy. He had defeated Jesus in this contest, but the question of God's righteousness still needed to be determined. He did not realize this battle was simply the first round in a long war. In the future, the Redeemer would bring salvation to the human race and prove that God is righteous. (Genesis 3:15)

"And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel." Genesis 3:15

One rebellious act by Adam and Eve plunged the human race into spiritual darkness. This single act saw humanity judged and sentenced to suffer the effects of sin until the end of the world would occur thousands of years in the future.

BEFORE THE SECOND FLOOD

There will be a millennial kingdom that will rise during the end times. Jesus will personally rule the earth and it will be a period of tranquility because Lucifer is locked away.

"And I saw an angel come down from heaven, having the key of the bottomless pit and a great chain in his hand. And he laid hold on the dragon, that old serpent, which is the Devil, and Satan, and bound him a thousand years, And cast him into the bottomless pit, and shut him up, and set a seal upon him, that he should deceive the nations no more, till the thousand years should be fulfilled: and after that he must be loosed a little season." (Revelation 20:1-3)

Lucifer and his minions are released for a short time at the end of a thousand years to wreak havoc upon the people who lived through this incredible time.

"And when the thousand years are expired, Satan shall be loosed out of his prison." (Revelation 20:7)

After the fall of man, Lucifer and the fallen angels took up residence in the skies, while the demons spread out upon the earth like ants.

"Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." (Ephesians 6:10-12)

The human race collectively died spiritually as a result of Adam's sin and mankind has not been operating at peak efficiency since that time.

Remember, Adam was created with a body, soul, and spirit. When he chose to join Eve in eating the forbidden fruit, the warning by Jesus was fulfilled as his spirit died, rending him body, soul, and dead spirit. Certainly not what God created or intended. Every human being is infected with the sinful nature and demons derive pleasure in possessing individuals and controlling them.

"Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned: (For until the law sin was in the world: but sin is not imputed when there is no law. Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over them that had not sinned after the similitude of Adam's transgression, who is the figure of him that was to come." (Romans 5:12-14)

Lucifer ordered the fallen angels to organize the evil spirits and pervert God's intention for the refurbished earth by starting wars and encouraging murder. Cain was the first person to be possessed by evil spirits and they enticed him to kill his brother. Was it a coincidence that Abel practiced the true worship of God and his brother had gone astray?

Satan knew that the Godhead would introduce a Redeemer to the human race sometime in the future. He decided the next attack was introducing a mixture that consisted of fallen angel and

humanity. These hybrids would only have a physical body; there would be no dead spirit to redeem. Once the human race was fully contaminated, it would force the Godhead to abandon the Redeemer project, or at the very least, include the fallen angels in the redemption plan. Think about that for a moment. In one action, Lucifer was setting up a getting-out-of-jail free card that would enable him to avoid the Lake of Fire. This was the endgame all along.

There were two hundred angels that worked with the Godhead to create people on different planets. They still retained their skill and knowledge after the war in heaven. After they joined Lucifer's rebellion, they were subsequently ordered to create physical bodies which could be possessed and used to procreate with human women. These two hundred fallen angels chose Mount Hermon in modern day Syria as their headquarters.⁴

"And it came to pass, when men began to multiply on the face of the earth, and daughters were born unto them, That the sons of God saw the daughters of men that they were fair; and they took them wives of all which they chose.

And the LORD said, My spirit shall not always strive with man, for that he also is flesh: yet his days shall be an hundred and twenty years.

There were giants in the earth in those days; and also after that, when the sons of God came in unto the daughters of men, and they bare children to them, the same became mighty men which were of old, men of renown." (Genesis 6:1-4)

Enoch was born some 700 years after the birth of Seth. He was a special man who was given many revelations and witnessed the evil being perpetrated on earth by Lucifer and his minions.

"And Jared lived after he begat Enoch eight hundred years, and begat sons and daughters: And all the days of Jared were nine hundred sixty and two years: and he died.

And Enoch lived sixty and five years, and begat Methuselah: And Enoch walked with God after he begat Methuselah three hundred years, and begat sons and daughters: And all the days of Enoch were three hundred sixty and five years:

And Enoch walked with God: and he was not; for God took him." (Genesis 5:19-24)

"By faith Enoch was translated that he should not see death; and was not found, because God had translated him: for before his translation he had this testimony, that he pleased God." (Hebrews 11:5)

Enoch was the sixth generation from Adam and he walked closely with the Lord. He was taken to heaven several times and wrote two books while he was alive on earth so that future generations would have a record of what had taken place. The following details are gleaned from the sixth chapter of the first Book of Enoch:

Semyaz was the leader of 200 fallen angels charged by Lucifer to make human bodies. He knew their actions would violate God's will and did not trust them. He did not want to solely incur God's wrath and had this group swear an oath that they would be collectively responsible for what they were about to do.

Semyaz divided the group into ten teams as they worked to create physical bodies for themselves. Since Jesus had limited the technological level with Adam and Eve, Lucifer ordered these fallen angels to introduce a greater level of technology to humanity so they could produce weapons of war. Each angel selected multiple women to become their wives. When these women gave birth, there was no redemption for the hybrid (angel/human) baby produced. The offspring of these fallen angels became known as "Nephilim." Mankind was forced to submit because of the superior weaponry of the fallen angels.

Adam was assigned by Jesus to maintaining the Garden of Eden. Since the refurbished world at that time was perfect, there was no need for hand tools made out of metal. There were no weeds. The ice canopy enveloping the outer atmosphere created the perfect climate. The north and south poles had no ice covering and the continent of Antarctica was ice free and the same temperature as on any other place on earth.

The earth was full of people on every continent from Adam and Eve conceiving children for more than thousand years during the day of rest. The Bible does not explain how these people migrated, we can deduce that they spread out from the Garden of Eden in the vicinity of modern-day Iraq and Iran.

TRANSFER OF TECHNOLOGY

The offspring of Adam and Eve were sinless until the first man and women chose to rebel against Jesus. There were no wars or conflicts because sin was not yet in play. When everyone died spiritually, Lucifer regained his status as prince of the earth. The plan was to usher in war to the human race and this required a higher form of technology.

Adam was not given any knowledge of mining by Jesus since He intended the civilizations of earth to be agrarian. Fallen angels deviated from this

plan and taught mankind how to locate deposits of gold, silver, copper, iron, etc. since Lucifer wanted weapons and other things produced.

The Godhead issued a decree that Lucifer was not allowed to introduce electricity to mankind, who would be limited to hand tools for the time being. The fallen angels demonstrated how to dig mining shafts and extract the ore. They built sites where ore was crushed, heated in ovens, and the desired metal extracted. Humans were taught how to make digging tools like shovels and bars along with swords, knives, shields, and breastplates.

Everyone on earth spoke the same language, but Lucifer wanted to divide and conquer. This is why he divided mankind into geographical areas, setting up rulers and nations. Demons infested the people and they gradually became dissatisfied with the land they possessed. Competition developed over time and this turned into wars as the grass is always greener on the other side.

Adam and Eve and all their progeny knew Jesus as God, but demon gods were introduced with each subsequent generation after the fall of mankind. These false gods taught the people how to fashion idols and worship them. Bracelets and other ornaments, along with cosmetics painted on the face and bodies were used for demon worship.

The fallen angels introduced the concept of makeup so humans could present themselves in front of the new Luciferian idols. The demons inferred they would have supernatural powers by changing their appearance. This type of thinking can be seen in the life of Queen Jezebel. She was the Baal priestess in Israel. When Ahab was killed in battle, she tried to hang on to power as queen. When she realized that Jehu was coming for her, she prepared herself spiritually by applying makeup and attiring her head. She went to a window to supernaturally use her power as a witch/priestess of Baal to rebuff Jehu. Her demon power did not work and she was subsequently thrown out the window and killed.

"And when Jehu was come to Jezreel, Jezebel heard of it; and she painted her face, and tired her head, and looked out at a window. And as Jehu entered in at the gate, she said, Had Zimri peace, who slew his master? And he lifted up his face to the window, and said, Who is on my side? who? And there looked out to him two or three eunuchs. And he said, Throw her down. So they threw her down: and some of her blood was sprinkled on the wall, and on the horses: and he trode her under foot." (2 Kings 9:30-33)

Mankind was shown how to make natural remedies from plants and herbs and certain men and women became witches that led the people in idolatry. The natural remedies were not evil but they were used by the demons to lead people into the supernatural realm and increase the demonization of the human race. Incantations and the worship of idols became the norm for the people using natural remedies to heal the sick.

Human sacrifice was introduced alongside animals to false gods. In a short amount of time, the masses were demon possessed and more hybrids continued to be produced each year. The goal of contaminating mankind was becoming a reality.

Some of the fallen angels began tinkering with the DNA of animals, trees and vegetation and genetically modifying the different species on earth. The pristine condition of the refurbished earth was being systematically decimated.

Fallen angels educated humanity in writing and the use of ink and paper to record false doctrine and preserve the incantations and ceremonies being taught to the people. Ship building and navigation was another thing being taught. With people living all over the planet, the fallen angels needed people to have the skill to build ships so armies could be sent to make war on the different continents. This is why the people were not surprised when Noah built an ark.

Women were instructed how to abort babies they did not want. An aborted baby was an extra treat for the burnt sacrifices to the demon gods.

Fallen angels introduced flagellation, where sexual pleasure is derived from inflicting and/or receiving pain on another person or oneself. There is a modern segment of society that still practices sadomasochism.

The concept of sexual activity with another of the same gender was pioneered. Even though it was physically impossible to procreate in this manner, pleasure could still be obtained via homosexuality and this wicked and degrading behavior took root.

The goal of all this debauchery was to corrupt mankind and violate God's laws to the point that Adam's descendants were abhorrent to their Creator. This is precisely what took place during the 1,600 years after the introduction of sin.

"And GOD saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.

And it repented the LORD that he had made man on the earth, and it grieved him at his heart. And the LORD said, **I will destroy man** whom I have created from the face of the earth; both man, and beast, and the creeping thing, and the fowls of the air; for it repenteth me that I have made them.

But Noah found grace in the eyes of the LORD.

These are the generations of Noah: Noah was a just man and perfect in his generations, and Noah walked with God. And Noah begat three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

The earth also was corrupt before God, and the earth was filled with violence. And God looked upon the earth, and, behold, it was corrupt; for all flesh had corrupted his way upon the earth.

And God said unto Noah, The end of all flesh is come before me; for the earth is filled with violence through them; and, behold, I will destroy them with the earth." (Genesis 6:5-13)

IESUS MOVES INTO ACTION

Before Jesus flooded the earth, He ordered holy angels to arrest the two hundred fallen angels responsible for the hybrid mutation and put them in a special prison called "Tartarus." Examine the two following passages of Scripture:

"For if God spared not the angels that sinned, but **cast them down to hell**,5 and delivered them into chains of darkness, to be reserved unto judgment; And spared not the old world, but saved Noah the eighth person, a preacher of righteousness, bringing in the flood upon the world of the ungodly." (2 Peter 2:4-5)

"And the angels which kept not their first estate, but left their own habitation, he hath

reserved in everlasting chains under darkness unto the judgment of the great day." (Jude 1:6)

Jesus told Noah to build a ship that was sufficiently large to save his family, along with enough space for the animals, birds and creeping things God wanted to survive the coming global flood.

"Make thee an ark of gopher wood; rooms shalt thou make in the ark, and shalt pitch it within and without with pitch. And this is the fashion which thou shalt make it of: The length of the ark shall be three hundred cubits, the breadth of it fifty cubits, and the height of it thirty cubits. A window shalt thou make to the ark, and in a cubit shalt thou finish it above; and the door of the ark shalt thou set in the side thereof; with lower, second, and third stories shalt thou make it.

And, behold, I, even I, do bring a flood of waters upon the earth, to destroy all flesh, wherein is the breath of life, from under heaven; and every thing that is in the earth shall die. But with thee will I establish my covenant; and thou shalt come into the ark, thou, and thy sons, and thy wife, and thy sons' wives with thee.

And of every living thing of all flesh, two of every sort shalt thou bring into the ark, to keep them alive with thee; they shall be male and female. Of fowls after their kind, and of cattle after their kind, of every creeping thing of the earth after his kind, two of every sort shall come unto thee, to keep them alive.

And take thou unto thee of all food that is eaten, and thou shalt gather it to thee; and it shall be for food for thee, and for them. Thus did Noah; according to all that God commanded him, so did he." (Genesis 6:14-22)

God commissioned the ark and 120 years later it was completed. Noah was 600 years, two months and 17 days old when Jesus ordered angels to collapse the ice canopy surrounding the earth, causing it to rain for forty consecutive days and nights. Deep reservoirs within the earth were opened to flood the earth so that the highest mountain peak was under 22.5 feet of water. This worldwide flood lasted five months before Noah set foot on dry land again.⁶

THE OLD WORLD WILL RETURN

I have shared the events of eternity past because it is important to know why we exist. Winston Churchill said, "Those that fail to learn from history are doomed to repeat it." This is absolutely true. Humanity needs to know how and why certain events took place in the past and what it means for us today. This is why it is necessary to know about the events leading up to Noah's flood and why Jesus warned the world will revert to that ugly time again.

"Verily I say unto you, This generation shall not pass, till all these things be fulfilled. Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away. But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only.

But **as the days of Noe were, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.** For as in the
days that were before the flood they were eating

and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark, And knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.

Then shall two be in the field; the one shall be taken, and the other left. Two women shall be grinding at the mill; the one shall be taken, and the other left. Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come." (Matthew 24:34-42)

The world that was is coming back. The past is our future.

"After this I beheld, and, lo, a great multitude, which no man could number, of all nations, and kindreds, and people, and tongues, stood before the throne, and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and palms in their hands; And cried with a loud voice, saying, Salvation to our God which sitteth upon the throne, and unto the Lamb.

And all the angels stood round about the throne, and about the elders and the four beasts, and fell before the throne on their faces, and worshipped God, Saying, Amen: Blessing, and glory, and wisdom, and thanksgiving, and honour, and power, and might, be unto our God for ever and ever. Amen.

And one of the elders answered, saying unto me, What are these which are arrayed in white robes? and whence came they?

And I said unto him, Sir, thou knowest. And he said to me, **These are they which came out of great tribulation**, and have washed their robes, and made them white in the blood of the Lamb."
(Revelation 7:9-14)

Anyone who reads the Bible knows a time of great tribulation is coming during the reign of the Antichrist. The good times are going to end, to be replaced with tremendous hardship and misery. That is the warning from Jesus. The prophetic words of the Son of God are like receiving the playbook of an opposing team. You know their moves and what they intend to do during game time. This means that you need to be ready when that moment arrives.

It all starts with salvation. Jesus is the Creator and the Redeemer promised to Adam 6,000 years ago. The eternal life offered to humanity was part of a plan that predated the angels in eternity past. This is what the apostle John is describing as he illustrates the exertions of the Antichrist.

"And all that dwell upon the earth shall worship him, whose names are not written in the book of life of the Lamb **slain from the foundation of the world**." (Revelation 13:8)

No one, not even the angels, were aware of this secret plan. Only the Godhead knew the details.

"But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery, even the hidden wisdom, which God ordained before the world unto our glory: Which none of the princes of this world knew: for had they known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory." (1 Corinthians 2:7-8)

Jesus said that no man can make it to heaven apart from Him.

"Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: **no man cometh unto the Father, but by me**." (John 14:6)

I have shared how the apostle Peter received an amazing revelation from the Holy Spirit. The next verse speaks of Jesus' love for humanity and His desire that we repent.

"But, beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance." (2 Peter 3:8-9)

No human being is perfect. We all fall short of the gold standard after Adam and Eve ate the forbidden fruit from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil.

"For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

The good news is that the Godhead still loves humanity, and Jesus as the Redeemer, paid for the sins of every person on earth.

"But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8)

The salvation offered by God is a gift. It can't be bought. This unmerited favor is offered free of charge and carries no special conditions or restrictions. This means it is not a works-based salvation that you have to earn. The redemption offered by Jesus is a gift that you humbly accept.

"For the wages of sin is death; but **the gift of God is eternal life** through Jesus Christ our
Lord." (Romans 6:23)

"For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them." (Ephesians 2:8-10)

God the Father loved humanity enough to send God the Son to pay for Adam's transgression. The decision of the first man continues to affect all of mankind.

"Wherefore, as **by one man sin entered into the world**, and death by sin; and so death
passed upon all men, for that all have sinned."
(Romans 5:12)

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved." (John 3:16-17)

God loves you and wants to save you. All you need to do is repent and ask God to forgive you. The word "repent" means to change your direction. You've been running away from God, now it's time to start running toward him.

"He hath not dealt with us after our sins; nor rewarded us according to our iniquities. For as the heaven is high above the earth, so great is his mercy toward them that fear him. **As far as**

the east is from the west, so far hath he removed our transgressions from us."

(Psalms 103:10-12)

Jesus does not play favorites. Adam's eviction after his rebellion in the Garden of Eden should be a clear indicator of that truth. This means that what Jesus has done in the past, He will continue to do now and into the future. He certainly is not going to look down upon you because of your past and there isn't a sin so great that it cannot be forgiven.

"Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever." (Hebrews 13:8)

"For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved." (Romans 10:13)

Talking to Jesus is quite simple. It doesn't have to take place in a church; it can occur anywhere. This is not about being religious, but to develop a personal relationship with your Creator, who loves you and is unpretentiously waiting for you to reach out to Him. The following prayer is a model of how to approach God the Father.

A Sinner's Prayer

I confess that I am a sinner who needs to be saved from my sins. Jesus, I ask that you forgive me of every sinful thing I have done. Come into my life and be my Lord and Savior. I believe that you paid for my sins on the cross through the blood you shed for me, and that you died rose from the grave. Thank you for giving me eternal life and a place in heaven with you. Help me to be obedient and to walk with you.

It can be much, much simpler. Case in point, there was a man crucified alongside Jesus. He looked at the Redeemer and essentially said, "Remember me when you get to heaven." That was it. No elegant

words. Jesus looked at him and said, "Today, you will be with me on the other side." The Creator looked at the man's soul and saw that he was repentant. That's it. It's that simple.

"All things are naked and opened unto the eyes of him with whom we have to do." (Hebrews 4:13b)
