Promised Land, but they had to pass a faith test! Numbers 13:1-3, 16-25
When the leaders of the twelve tribes came back, they brought an evil report.
Numbers 13:26-33
Only one man, Caleb believed in God. verse 30
Once the people heard the evil report, all their faith in God was cast away and
they became angry and resentful toward God and Moses. Numbers 14:1-4
Not even Moses could still them in their unbelief and anger. verses 5-9
They were fed up with God, and desired to kill Moses. verse 10
God had enough; he was going to kill them all. verses 11-12
Moses intervened for the people. verses 13-19
God forgave them, but they were not allowed to enter the land of Canaan.
Those who were 20 years old and upward were sentenced to die and wander
in the wilderness for the next 40 years because of their unbelief.
verses 20-37
Only Joshua and Caleb were spared from this sentence and allowed to enter
the Promised Land! verse 38
When the people heard their sentence, they began to grieve! But it was too
late; their chance to enter the Promised Land was gone forever! They tried to
repent, but God refused to accept it! verses 39-41
The people tried in their own power to enter the Promised Land and failed,
which resulted in many of them being killed. verses 42-45
