	Moses believed in the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob but needed his faith built up. <b>Exodus 4:1-9</b>
	Those closest to Jesus didn't fully understand His power. They knew Lazarus would be resurrected one day in the future, they just didn't expect it right then. <b>John 11:1-45</b>

	❖ Jesus mentioned both Elijah and the widow. Luke 4:24-26

■ Even though the odds were 850:1, with the people of Israel sitting on the sideline, God demonstrated through Elijah that Baal was no match for Him. After three and a half years, God opened the heavens and let rain come down. 1 Kings 18:1-39
